


## Attendance Matters St Benet's



We are currently sitting at 90% overall attendance as a school, compared to 94% national and local authority. Currently 24.7% of the school population are considered as persistent absence. It would be really good to aim to reduce this significantly next term. Being in school is vital to progress.

We are currently sitting at 93.7% overall attendance as a school, compared to 94% national and local authority. Currently 14.9% of the school population is considered persistent absence. Whilst this is relatively low, the percentage of children in the 'at risk' category is quite high. So again, it would be great to try and get some of the amber into the green.

# **Heart of Gold**





This week in Rowan class our Heart of Gold for Temperance goes to Dylan. Over the last term he has been focused on his work and is always eager to learn. Recently, we have been


writing poetry and Dylan has enjoyed being creative and creating his own poems. Even when he finds something
