Our assembly this week continued to celebrate that Jesus is alive, He is our friend, and we can listen to and follow His voice. Through a role play about a wayward sheep, children thought about whose voice they choose to listen to – and that if we want to follow Jesus' voice, we need to recognise it!



"Jesus said, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish..."

John 10:27-28







Children will understand that:

- Jesus wants us to listen to His voice.
- We need to be able to recognise His voice amongst all other 'voices' that compete for our attention.
- We can know Jesus' voice because He is our friend we know our friends' voices!

Listening to the Voice of Jesus

In today's world, our lives – and the lives of our children – are filled with noise. Social media, television, peer pressure, and the demands of daily life can easily drown out the quiet, loving voice of Jesus. Yet, as followers of Christ, we are called to listen to His voice and recognise it above all others.

Jesus says in the Gospel of John, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:27)

So how can we help our children – and ourselves – to do this? Here are a few simple but meaningful ways:

- **Create quiet moments:** Encourage times of silence or prayer during the day, even if just for a few minutes. In stillness, we become better able to hear God speaking to our hearts.
- **Read Scripture together:** God's Word helps us to become familiar with His voice. Sharing Bible stories or short reflections as a family can open hearts and minds to Him.
- **Model discernment:** Talk with your child about making good choices and recognising what aligns with the love, peace, and truth of Jesus and what does not.
- **Pray regularly:** Prayer is conversation with God. Through prayer, children can learn to share with Jesus and listen in return, building a relationship that helps them trust and follow His guidance.

In a world full of distractions, it's more important than ever to help our children learn to recognise and follow the voice that leads to life, peace, and joy – the voice of Jesus.


Congratulations to Year 6!


