ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

Good attendance is vital to every child's learning and progress. Of course, we know that children will sometimes be unwell but please ensure you inform the school office by 9am each day of absence – our answerphone system means you can ring at any time. Absence request forms are available for special circumstances and will be considered in line with our policy and, where required, in consultation with governors.
