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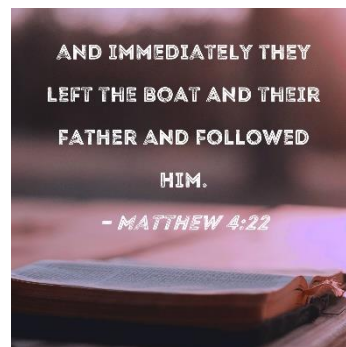

### **FRASSATI - THE MAN OF THE BEATITUDES**

This week at St. Edmund's, our worship centred on Jesus' teaching of the Beatitudes and the inspiring life of St Pier Giorgio Frassati. The children explored what it means to live as people of God's Kingdom, learning that kindness, humility and faithfulness are powerful ways of following Jesus. Through prayer and reflection on the lives of the saints, the children were encouraged to recognise their own gifts and to place their trust in God, giving thanks for all He does for us.

### **ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL**

We have had an increase in parents not informing school on the days that their child/ren are absent due to illness. This creates an additional burden on our office staff who have to make contact to find out the reason for the absence. On each day your child is unfit to come to school, please report this absence by calling the school on (01986 892502) and leaving a message on the child absence line (option 1) to let us know. This is operational 24/7 so please ring at anytime of the day/night to inform us. In the message you must leave your child's full name and class and give the specific reason for absence. The information you give will be recorded on our official register.

### **ATTENDANCE MONITORING**

Our half-termly attendance monitoring will take place next week. This is where we analyse the attendance of all our children and write to parents whose child/ren are identified as 'persistently absent' (attendance is below 90%). Where required, the Local Authority Education Welfare Officer will become involved to support. Our current whole school attendance percentage is 94.6% which is just below the current National average and well below our school target of 97%. If you need any support in improving your child's attendance, please contact the school office.

### **LUNCH BOOKINGS**

Please can you make sure you book your child's lunch in advance of the day through our WisePay system. We have seen an increase in children requiring a meal who haven't pre-ordered one. Where meals aren't booked in advance, there is a chance a limited menu will be available for selection.

## **WORLD BOOK DAY**

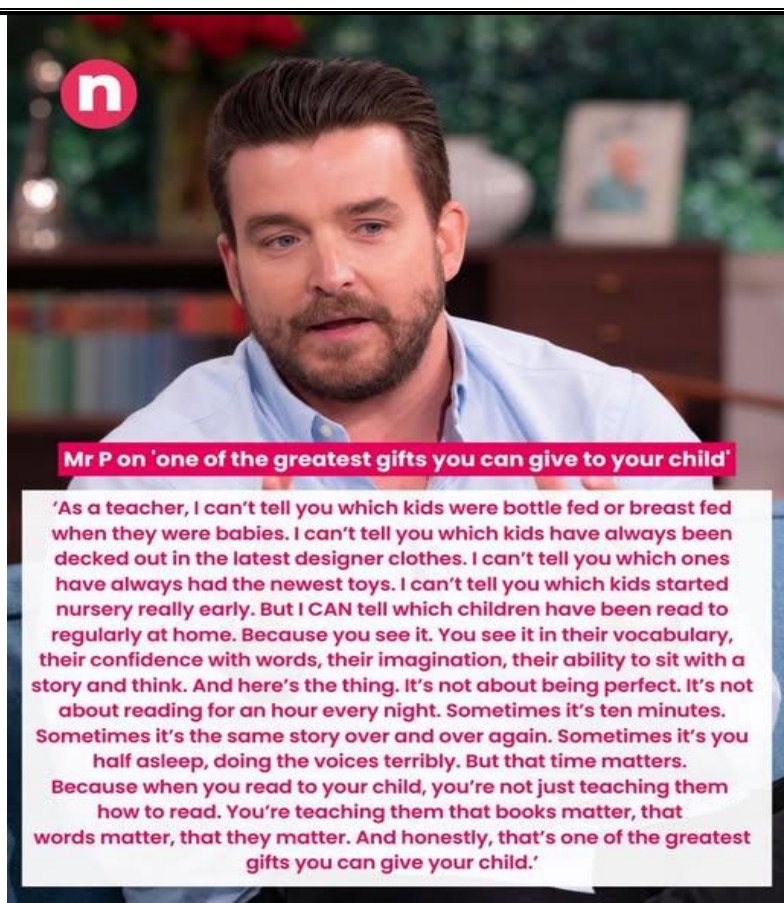
