KEY VOCABULARY AND SPELLINGS

Abraham – was originally called Abram but when he trusted God and left his home God renamed him Abraham which means Father of Many Nations. He and his wife Sarah had a son in their old age called Isaac.

Contract - a written or spoken agreement which is enforceable by law – usually with one side getting money or more from the agreement than the other.

Covenant - a promise – where both sides are equally committed.

Covet – desire to have something you don't have. **Exodus** – means a mass departure of people and is the

name of the second book in the Old Testament. Incarnation – Jesus becoming fully human as well as fully God. The words means embodied in flesh or putting on flesh.


Moses – a Hebrew prophet who freed the Jewish people from Egypt and received the Ten Commandments from God.

Mount Sinai – is the mountain on which God appeared to Moses and gave him the Ten Commandments. It is found in the remote and rugged desert of Egypt's Sinai Peninsula. Neighbour – according to Jesus is anyone who you meet. New Commandment - is a term used in Christianity to describe Jesus's commandment to "love one another". Relationship – the connection between people or between people and God.

Ten Commandments – a special set of laws which God wrote and gave to Moses on Mount Sinai.

Commandments

- 1. I am the Lord your God. You shall have no other gods before me.
- 2. You shall not use the name of the Lord your God in vain.
- Remember to keep the Lord's Day holy.
- 4. Honour your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbour's goods.
